

10 Things to Know About Registering Voters



1. Legal Qualifications to Vote:
 - a. 18 yrs old by the General
 - b. US Citizen
 - c. Resident of Wyoming and of the precinct the voter is registering in
 - d. Not convicted felon or adjudicated mentally incompetent
2. Voter Registration Application and Change form may be used to change party, change name, change address, withdraw from another state or county, and register new voters.
3. In Wyoming, these changes can all be made at the polls.
4. Wyoming Driver's License is preferred, but another state's ID with a SSN is acceptable.
5. Copy their ID number on the "Type of Identification" line on the application whether it's a Wyoming DL or another state.
6. Libertarian is no longer a major party. There is no libertarian ballot for the 2010 election. Voters may still choose to register as libertarian and forfeit their right to vote in the primary.
7. DOUBLE CHECK:
 - a. Birthday
 - b. Party Affiliation
 - c. ID number
 - d. Signature of Voter
 - e. Signature of Election Judge
8. Every elector signing the oath assumes the risk of committing the felony of false swearing.
9. Look up voters by address in the address library to register them in the correct District, Precinct, and Split. Write it in the top right section of the form.
 - a. A person may vote ONLY in the precinct in which he resides.
10. No matter how much a voter insists, if they are not in the Master List, they are not registered. Please ask them to fill out a new Voter Registration card.
