

**Park County Board of Commissioners**  
**April 3, 2007**  
**Regular Meeting**

Proceedings of a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Park County, Wyoming, held in Cody, Wyoming on Tuesday, April 3, 2007. Present were Commission Chair Bucky Hall, Commissioners Marie Fontaine, Tim French, Bill Brewer and Jill Shockley Siggins and County Clerk Kelly Jensen.

**Amend Agenda**

Commissioner French made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to amend the agenda to include presentation of landscaping quotes for the new Law Enforcement Center; quotes for the purchase of a mower for the Road and Bridge Department; and consideration of the job description for a Maintenance Mechanic III. Motion carried.

**Approval of Minutes**

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Shockley Siggins, to approve the minutes, as corrected, from the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners on March 20, 2007. Motion carried.

**Personnel Action Form – Road and Bridge**

Commissioner French made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to approve a Personnel Action Form to hire Ray Chris Carter as an Equipment Operator I in the Road and Bridge Department starting April 9, 2007. Motion carried.

**Mower Quote**

Commissioner Brewer made a motion, seconded by French, to authorize the Road and Bridge Department to accept a quote to purchase a Tiger Mower on a John Deere Tractor from Western Plains Machinery in Billings, Montana for \$75,845.00, the lowest quote that met specifications. Motion carried.

**Personnel Action Forms – Landfill**

Commissioner Shockley Siggins made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to approve six Personnel Action Forms for temporary employees to complete landfill area clean-up. Individuals and their start dates were: Salvador Flores 3/22/07; Deanne Weyland 3/22/07; Rene VanPelt 3/22/07; Casie Evans 3/23/07; Danial Peterson 3/23/07; and Tony Goswick 4/1/07. Voting in favor of the motion were Commissioners Shockley Siggins, Fontaine and Brewer. French abstained based on the hiring taking place prior to Board approval. Motion carried.

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to allow the Landfill Superintendent to hire up to eight temporary employees for the landfill clean-up project and allow the Chair to approve the Personnel Action Forms until the Board of County Commissioners can act on them at their next regular meeting. Motion carried.

**Personnel Action Form – Administrative Assistant**

Commissioner Shockley Siggins made a motion, seconded by French, to approve the Personnel Action Form for Brenda Bangert as a Secretary in the County Commissioners' office starting Monday, April 9, 2007. Motion carried.

**Out-of-State Travel Request - Sheriff**

Commissioner French made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to approve out-of-state travel requests for Investigator Trap Heydenberk to attend SWAT training in Utah April 25-May 2, 2007; and a Sheriff's Department employee to attend CEDAP equipment training that will likely be held in Florida in August. Approval of the CEDAP training allows the Sheriff to submit a request for equipment, with the training details to be provided at a later date. Motion carried.

**Homeland Security Grant**

Commissioner Brewer made a motion, seconded by Shockley Siggins, to approve and allow the chair to sign the contract for the Fiscal Year 2007 Department of Homeland Security Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) of \$29,042.00, requiring a \$29,042.00 match from Park County. Funds must be expended 10/1/06– 6/30/08. Motion carried. Commissioner Fontaine was not present for the vote.

### **Leases – Complex and Annex**

Commissioner French made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to approve a lease with Herrod Geoscience Consulting for 135 square feet at the rate of \$135 per month (\$12/sq ft) for nine months (May 1, 2007 – January 31, 2008) and a lease with Arial Software for approximately 1420 total square feet at varying rates per square foot for a total annual rent of \$15,580.00 or \$1,298.34 per month for twelve months (May 1, 2007 – April 30, 2008).

Commissioner French made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign a lease with the State of Wyoming for the Women and Infant Children (WIC) program for 265 square feet at the rate of \$2,981.99 per year (\$11.25/sq ft) or \$248.50 per month for one year (July 1, 2007 – June 30, 2008).

### **LEC Landscaping Quotes**

Commissioner French made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to accept a quote from Northern Gardens for \$20,363.00 to complete landscaping around the new Law Enforcement Center. Voting in favor of the motion were Commissioners French and Brewer and Chairman Hall. Opposed were Commissioners Fontaine and Shockley Siggins, based on the quote not being the lowest quote for the project. Motion carried.

### **Maintenance Mechanic III – Job Description**

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by French, to approve a job description, as presented, for a Maintenance Mechanic III in the Buildings and Grounds Department. Motion carried.

### **Right-of-Way Certificate for ADM Vacation**

Commissioner French made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to approve and allow the Chair to sign the Right-of-Way Certificate for the ADM Road Vacation. Motion carried.

### **Park County Weed & Pest Board**

Commissioner Shockley Siggins made a motion, seconded by French, to appoint Jim Cox to fill the unexpired term of Ed Reed on the Park County Weed and Pest Control District, through December 31, 2008. Motion carried.

### **Juvenile Accountability Block Grant**

Commissioner Shockley Siggins made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to approve and authorize the chair to sign the amendment for an expiration date change to 4/30/09 for the FY2006 Juvenile Justice Accountability Block Grant and to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the FY2004 Juvenile Justice Block Grant Contract providing \$10,253 in grant funds with a required match of \$1,140.00 and a contract term of March 1, 2007 – May 31, 2007. Motion carried.

### **Fiscal Year 2006 Audit Review**

Commissioners asked Administrative Assistant Peggy Ruble to schedule a meeting with Jim Dodson of Porter, Muirhead, Cornia & Howard, to meet with elected officials, department heads and appointed board members on May 8, 2007 to review audit recommendations and financial procedures. No action was taken.

### **Meeteetse Local Planning Area Advisory Committee**

Commissioner Fontaine offered to continue working with the Meeteetse Local Planning Area Advisory Committee on procedures to replace committee members. She will review by-laws presented by their chairman with the Park County Planner and Park County Attorney and bring additional information back to the Board. No action was taken.

### **WCDA/CDBG Housing Rehabilitation Project**

Park County Housing Rehabilitation Grant Coordinator Beth Wharton provided an update on the planned close-out of the WCDA/CDBG Housing Rehabilitation grant. Close-out is still anticipated in August of 2007. She reported that she will continue to assist with the program while on maternity leave and that John Parko will continue to provide services until the grant is closed out. No action was taken.

### **Public Hearing – Mesa Ocho, LLC**

Commission Chairman Hall opened a public hearing to consider the application of Mesa Ocho, LLC for an Amended Plat of Lot 25 of the Lower Spring Valley Subdivision. The property is located west of Sundown Drive, east of Road 2AB, with a

legal description of the NW1/4SW1/4NE1/4NE1/4 of Section 16, T53N, R101W, 6<sup>th</sup> p.m. Park County, Wyoming. It is located within the RR-2 (Rural Residential 2-Acre) zoning district.

There being no comments, Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Shockley Siggins, to close the public hearing. Motion carried.

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Shockley Siggins, to approve and authorize the chair to sign the Lower Spring Valley Subdivision Amended Plat. Motion carried.

### **Higgins-Tipton Subdivision Road Variance**

Chairman Hall opened a public hearing to consider an application by Crandall Properties, LLC for a Variance from Chapter 3, Section 2(c), Chapter 4, Section 2(i)(3)(b)(second sentence), and Chapter 4, Section 2(i)(3)(a&c) of the Park County Development Standards and Regulations. The property for which the variance is requested is located along Highway 296 in the community of Crandall. The legal description is land located within Homestead Entry Survey (H.E.S.) No. 177, T56N, R106W, 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Park County, Wyoming

Rob Overfield of Engineering Associates, presented the applicants' request for the variance, stating there are no new roads planned, existing roads are generally used seasonally for recreational access, and traffic has historically been minimal on the already existing roads. The applicants do not feel the County's required road improvements are necessary for current or future use. Overfield stated the applicants are willing to comply with the County Engineer's recommendations that easements and rights-of-way be established and recorded throughout the subdivision and they do not have concerns about the recommendation that there be two accesses to both sections of the subdivision, as dual accesses already exist for both areas. He also ensured the Board that the applicants will ensure that the rights-of-way will be established to allow an adequate radius for emergency equipment to turn. He stated the boundary line adjustments will not occur until after the Board takes action on the road variances. Their concern is that the recommended improvements to a twelve-foot width and three inch deep base for the roads would be cost prohibitive. Overfield stated the applicants intend to sell the land adjoining already existing lots to the current or neighboring lot owners to allow increased property size and prohibit future development.

Speaking in favor of the variance were Overfield and Julie Miller of Engineering Associates, Richard and Mallie Zickefoose of Crandall Properties and area residents Bill Hardy, Bruce Blevins, John Wasden, Tony Simek, Sher Blake, Nellie Raymond and Mike Reille. Neighboring landowner Jeff Umphlett (Lot 2A in the SU Subdivision) expressed concern that under the current proposal a long-existing access to his land would stop before reaching his land.

County Engineer Dave Kieper outlined recommendations for widened roads, deeper base and turnaround radiuses in order to meet current and future emergency response needs

There being no further comments, Commissioner French made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to close the public hearing. Motion carried.

Commissioner French made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to approve the variance of Crandall Properties, LLC from Chapter 3, Section 2(c), Chapter 4, Section 2(i)(3)(b)(second sentence), and Chapter 4, Section 2(i)(3)(a&c) of the Park County Development Standards and Regulations contingent upon the applicants establishing and recording forty (40) foot rights-of-way throughout the subdivision, including the road on Lot 177-22; establishing and recording a sixty (60) foot right-of-way for the south entrance off the north side of Highway 296; maintenance of two access roads for the subdivision off both sides of Highway 296; assurance that every lot will be provided access through an easement that is properly established and recorded; that easements for utilities be properly identified on the plat; that absolutely no additional expansion of the existing subdivision occur on the lands being acquired through the proposed boundary adjustments; that the land in the boundary adjustments be sold only to the adjacent or neighboring landowners (if adjacent landowners choose not to purchase); and that an access easement to Lot 2A in the SU Subdivision be established and properly recorded. Voting in favor of the motion were Commissioners French, Brewer and Shockley Siggins. Opposed was Commissioner Fontaine, stating the roads will continue to be an issue and will become even more costly in the future. Motion carried.

### **Executive Session**

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to go into executive session pursuant to Wyoming Statute 16-4-405(a)(ix) and 16-4-405(a)(ii) to consider or receive confidential information and personnel matters. Motion carried.

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by French, to go out of executive session and return to the regular meeting. Motion carried.

**Fiscal Year 2008 Budget and Project Priorities**

Commissioners held a Work Session in the Old Law Library to hear, without taking action, anticipated expenditure and revenue information for Fiscal Year 2008 as well as new State Loan and Investment Board (SLIB) funding procedures and requirements. A decision on the SLIB funding will be made at the April 10, 2007 regular Board of County Commissioners' meeting.
