

**Park County Board of Commissioners
February 6, 2007**

Proceedings of a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Park County, Wyoming, held in Cody, Wyoming on Tuesday, February 6, 2007. Present were Commission Chair Bucky Hall, Commissioners Marie Fontaine, Bill Brewer and Jill Shockley Siggins and County Clerk Kelly Jensen. Absent was Commissioner Tim French.

Library Budget Shortfall

Park County Library Director Frances Clymer presented information relating to a budget shortfall in the Library budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2007. Funding originally proposed to be set aside as operating cash into the new fiscal year was inadvertently budgeted as cash, which will deplete all funds as of June 30, 2007 leaving no money to operate at the beginning of FY08. Clymer asked the Board to restore \$142,125.00 to the Library Budget.

Commissioner Brewer made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to restore the \$142,125.00 that was removed from the Library Budget by advertising the transfer from the remaining funds in operational reserves and the remainder from cash reserves. Motion carried.

Powell EMTs and Hospital – Letters of Support

Powell Hospital Director Rod Barton and Assistant Director of Emergency Medical Services Scott Bagnell presented a request to the Board of County Commissioners for letters of support for projects being submitted to the State Land and Investment Board for grant funds for expansion of the Powell Hospital (50% of the \$2 million difference in original cost and bids) and purchase of two new ambulances (50% of \$95,000 per ambulance).

Commissioner Shockley Siggins made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to submit a letter of support to the State Land and Investment Board for the Powell Hospital Expansion grant application. Motion carried.

Commissioner Shockley Siggins made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to submit a letter of support to the State Land and Investment Board for a grant application to purchase two new ambulances. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to approve the minutes as corrected for the January 16 regular meeting and special meetings on January 24 and January 29, 2007 Board of Park County Commissioner meetings. Motion carried.

Assistant Planner Position Recommendation

County Planner Linda Gillett recommended a candidate from those interviewed for the position of Assistant Planner. She stated the primary responsibilities will involve zoning enforcement rather than planning administration. Commissioners authorized, without taking action, Gillett's request to contact the top candidate and offer the position pending approval by the Board of County Commissioners at a later date.

Juror Appreciation Day

District Court Clerk Joyce Boyer described the Tuesday, May 1, 2007 statewide Juror Appreciation Day celebration being coordinated by Wyoming Bar Association President Gay Woodhouse. Boyer stated the Park County Committee includes Clerks of Court, a Judge and several attorneys. The expected budget is approximately \$1000 for contest prizes, food and giveaways. Boyer asked the Board to consider a monetary contribution to assist with the project.

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Shockley Siggins, to challenge members of the Park County Bar Association by matching their donations up to a maximum of \$500 total from the County. Motion carried.

Lane 9 West - Phase 1 Reconstruction Pay Estimate

County Project Manager Mike Collier presented the first pay estimate for the Lane 9 West – Phase 1 Reconstruction Project as a means to outline the process that will be used for each pay estimate as the project progresses. He described the retainage (for work and

material stored) and release of retainage as the project proceeds. No action was required or taken.

Hangar Lease Purchase Agreement

Park County Search and Rescue Coordinator Kirk Waggoner presented a lease from Jim McArtor for a hangar at Yellowstone Regional Airport (YRA) for the Search and Rescue airplane. Waggoner stated County Attorney Bryan Skoric recommended the lease state it is to be signed pending the Yellowstone Regional Airport Board approving the lease transfer. Waggoner will also coordinate the payment schedule to coincide with the County budget and work with Buildings and Grounds Superintendent Mike Vowell to ensure property insurance is provided through Wyoming Association of Risk Management (WARM). Waggoner stated there is donated money in the Search and Rescue budget to pay the increase in the rental rates.

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to approve the amended lease agreement, as corrected, subject to approval by the YRA Board. Motion carried.

Amend Agenda

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to amend the agenda to consider the transfer of licensing, management and operation of the McCoullough Peaks tower site. Motion carried.

KCWC translator

Chief Information Officer Mike Conners presented a recommendation that the County transfer the licensing, management and operation of the McCoullough Peaks tower site to Central Wyoming College's KCWC-TV and authorize Chairman Hall to sign the agreement. The agreement has been reviewed and approved by County Attorney Bryan Skoric.

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to approve a contract to transfer the licensing, operation and management of the McCoullough Peaks tower site to Central Wyoming College's KCWC-TV and to authorize Chairman Hall to sign the contract. Motion carried.

Meeteetse Local Planning Area Advisory Committee

Commissioner Fontaine reported she met with County Attorney Bryan Skoric regarding the appointment of members to the Meeteetse Local Planning Advisory Committee. She stated Skoric recommended term for the three current members would end January 1, 2009 and the Board advertise the two vacation positions whose term would end January 1, 2010.

Commissioner Shockley Siggins made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to send a letter to Chairman Mike May asking the three current members to serve until January 1, 2009, and advertise two additional appointments to serve until January 1, 2010. Motion carried.

Yellowstone National Park Winter Use Discussion

Chairman Hall updated the Board on the Yellowstone National Park Winter Use discussion, stating information from Ecosystem Research Group (ERG) to the Board of County Commissioners was also given to Governor Freudenthal and the group, including Commissioner French, who are traveling to Washington DC to meet with Park Service Administrators and the Wyoming Congressional delegation. No action was taken.

Shut Out of Yellowstone

Carol J. Armstrong and Terry Hinkle appeared before the Board of County Commissioners to encourage participation in a forum being coordinated by the Park County Republican Women called Shut Out of Yellowstone. The event will be held at the Cody Auditorium and is tentatively scheduled on March 24, 2007. The forum coordinators wrote to legislators, mayors and Chambers of Commerce seeking letters of support. The event will encourage media coverage of the issue and will include an opportunity for video interviews with Northfork residents impacted by the closure of the east entrance. They stated former U.S. Senator Alan Simpson and his wife Ann have agreed to assist and will contact Vice President Richard Cheney and National Park Service Director Mary Bomar. The Board encouraged Armstrong and Hinkle to contact the Cody and Powell Economic Development groups to lend support of the forum. No action was taken.

Forman Simple Subdivision SS-121

Assistant County Planner Nikki Burnett presented the Forman Simple Subdivision whose applicants are Michael and Lois Forman. It is described as two-lot subdivision totaling 10.92+/- acres for Lot 1 and 10.65 +/- acres for Lot 2 with an exempt parcel of 105.45 +/- acres, in the GR-P zoning district from an original parcel containing 127.02 +/- acres within Lots 5 and 6 of Section 13, T. 55 N., R. 101 W., 6th P.M., Park County, Wyoming.

Commissioner Shockley Siggins made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to adopt **RESOLUTION 2007-04; APPROVAL OF A FINAL PLAT FOR THE FORMAN SS-121 SIMPLE SUBDIVISION WITHIN LOTS 5 AND 6 OF SECTION 13, T. 55 N., R. 101 W., 6TH P.M., PARK COUNTY, WYOMING.** Motion carried.

Robinson Simple Subdivision SS-126

Assistant County Planner Nikki Burnett presented the Robinson Simple Subdivision-126 whose applicants are Earl Robinson and Mary Ellen Ibarra-Robinson. It is described as a two-lot subdivision totaling 1.32+/- acres for Lot 1 and 1.32 +/- acres for Lot 2, located in the GR-P zoning district from an original parcel containing 2.64 +/- acres in the N. 353' of the W. 326.5' Lot 49-L, Lot 49, Resurvey, T. 55 N., R. 99 W., 6th P.M., Park County, Wyoming.

Schott Simple Subdivision SS-125

Assistant County Planner Nikki Burnett presented the Schott Simple Subdivision-125 whose applicant is Kyle Schott. It is described as a two-lot subdivision totaling 28.15 +/- acres for Lot 1 and 9.12 +/- acres for Lot 2, in the GR-P zoning district from an original parcel containing 37.27 +/- acres within Lot 41-I, Lot 41, Resurvey, T. 55 N., R. 98 W., 6th P.M., Park County, Wyoming.

Commissioner Brewer made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to adopt **RESOLUTION 2007-06; APPROVAL OF A FINAL PLAT FOR THE SCHOTT SS-125 SIMPLE SUBDIVISION WITHIN LOT 41-I, LOT 41, RESURVEY, T. 55 N., R. 98 W., 6TH P.M., PARK COUNTY, WYOMING.** Motion carried.

Hilton Simple Subdivision SS-98

Assistant County Planner Nikki Burnett presented the Hilton Simple Subdivision-98 whose applicants are Charles and Deloris Hilton. It is described as a two-lot subdivision totaling 20.29 +/- acres for Lot 1 and 15.76 +/- acres for Lot 2, in the GR-5 zoning district from an original parcel containing 36.05 +/- acres total within Lots 53 and 54, T. 52 N., R. 102 W., 6th P.M., Park County, Wyoming.

Commissioner Shockley Siggins made a motion, seconded by Fontaine, to adopt **RESOLUTION 2007-07; APPROVAL OF A FINAL PLAT FOR THE HILTON SS-98 SIMPLE SUBDIVISION WITHIN LOTS 53 AND 54, T. 52 N., R. 102 W., 6TH P.M., PARK COUNTY, WYOMING.** Motion carried.

DeMaris Building Recommendations

Ray Maple, Chairman of the Park County Historic Preservation Commission presented a recommendation that the DeMaris Building be left on its current location and that a final decision on the building be delayed until a private local group currently being formed can present a plan to restore the building, which was constructed in 1927.

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to table the decision on the DeMaris building until the Board receives additional information on preserving the building. Motion carried.

Fire District No. 2 Health Insurance

Russ Wenke, Administrator of Park County Fire District No. 2 presented a request for the Fire District employees to be added to the County's health insurance program. Commissioners authorized staff, without taking action, to explore the ability for the Fire District employees to be added to the County's insurance pool.

Proposed Roadway Vacation – Reuter

County Engineer Dave Kieper provided an update on a request from Alan Reuter for portions of County Road Lane 4W and Road 3N be vacated and Reuter will rebuild the

road at a different location. Kieper reported that Reuter provided the County \$2,000.00 to begin the advertisement and vacation process. County Engineer Kieper asked the Board to confirm their interest in proceeding with a survey and notice in the paper to vacate the proposed two sections of road. He stated acceptance of the new road is a separate issue that will be brought before the Board at a later date. The Board encouraged Kieper to move forward. No formal action was taken.

Executive Session per W.S. 16-4-405(a)(ix)

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Shockley Siggins, to enter into executive session pursuant Wyoming Statute 16-4-405(a)(ix), Confidential by Law. Motion carried.

Commissioner Fontaine made a motion, seconded by Brewer, to exit executive session and return to the regular meeting. Motion carried.

Copperleaf Major Subdivision

Chairman Hall opened a public hearing at 7:00 p.m.

The public hearing was held to consider the Copperleaf Major Subdivision request for a change to Subdivision Permit Approval and Final Plat Approval (Resolution 2006-16) to allow the use of three water supply wells as approved by the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality, Permit No. 06-274RR in the GR-5 (General Rural 5-Acre) Zoning District. The property is located north of Highway 14-16-20 (Northfork Highway), west of the community of Wapiti and east of the Shoshone National Forest.

The legal description is property located within Section 15: SE1/4SW1/4, SW1/4SW1/4, SE1/4SE1/4, Lots 7 and 8, Section 22: NE1/4, NE1/4NE1/4, Section 23: NW1/4, NW1/4NW1/4, T. 52 N., R. 105 W., 6th P.M. Park County, Wyoming. Worthington Group of Wyoming is the applicant
